

Primary Physical Education and Sport Premium **Government Funding – June 2017**

How have we spent the funding?

The Government Premium £9K in 2016-2017 is being spent on a wide range of extras:

We have bought into Forge School Sport Partnership (Forge SSP) Elite Membership which will have enabled us to offer a wide range of activities to our pupils, staff and community members. We also pool a portion of our funding with the other 3 local schools to enable a sport specialist to continue the work that was undertaken by the previous School Sport Coordinator from Handsworth Grange Community Sports College.

CPD

Through the use of coaches teachers in Y1, Y3 and Y6 have developed their teaching skills of fundamental basic skills, rugby and sports hall athletics .

In addition to this all Lunch time supervisors and TAs have been trained to lead playground leaders successfully.

Whole school training on maximising active PE lessons to develop and progress skills.

Coaching

The funding has significantly increased the participation of children in after school clubs ran by specialist sports coaches.

We have planned/delivered the following:

- Sportshall athletics for Y6 children
- Handball for Y4 children
- Basic gross motor skills for all 60 Y1 children
- We have/had further after school clubs taking place including Yoga for Y2 and Rounders for mixed KS2

Competitions and Festivals

- We have access to 15 Level 2 Sainsbury School Games and Forge SSP Competitions throughout the school year.
- We have access to 7 KS1 and KS2 Forge SSP Virtual Competitions throughout the year.
- We plan to attend 9 Handsworth Family Festivals/Competitions throughout the school year.
- Have planned our Sainsbury School Games Level 1 Sports Day to take place on 20th July 2017 for both KS1 and KS2
- Have planned our Sainsbury School Games Level 1 Sports Day to take place on 19th July 2017 for Foundation Stage 2
- Have planned whole school sporting activities to take place within the week of National Sports / Healthy schools week commencing from 26th June 2017. These include coach led workshops of Karate and worldwide traditional dance

Elite Membership of School Sports Partnership has seen us take part in the following competitions and festivals so far this year:

Equipment

The Government Funding has allowed us to enhance and replenish our sports equipment for the whole school. This has enhanced the quality of PE lessons and increased skills and enthusiasm of children and staff. We have purchased a wide range of equipment to benefit the whole school including:

- Replenished soft foam balls, tennis balls, shot puts, bean bags, hoola hoops (range of sizes)
- Replenished broken equipment: javelins, parachute games,
- Action/sequence floor spots for sports and gymnastic moves,
- Electric pump for balls,
- Target nets for developing hand eye coordination,
- River stepping stones to develop gross motor coordination, balance and upper core stability,
- Multi-purpose cones – to be used with hoops to enhance creative PE lessons,
- Action talk balls to be used in FS2 and KS1
- Rechargeable speed timers for KS2 running skills,
- Storage equipment to reorganise the outdoor PE store cupboard- a range of clear boxes and large tubs for balls. This has enabled secure storing of equipment and easy access for staff.
- Permanent outdoor basketball and netball posts with safety covers in the KS2 yard including costs of digging hole in yard and concreting in (£1,977.00)
- Travel costs to attend competitions (£981.00)

Additional benefits

In addition to the above we plan to, or already have:

- Attended family of school update meetings to access new opportunities and plan ahead
- Completed a school audit of PE and School Sport
- Have trained 20 Y5 pupils in the nationally accredited SLUK Playmakers Award
- Offer access to National Governing Body sport specific training to staff, parents and community members
- Provide local sport club contact details for pupils when necessary
- Will apply for the Sainsbury School Games Kitemark in the next window
- Are Primary Members of the Youth Sport Trust (YST) and plan to apply for YST Quality Kitemark
- Will access Health sessions via Handsworth Grange Community Sports College for both Y6 Classes

- Will access transition based activities in partnership with Handsworth Grange Community Sports College for the current Y6 pupils during Summer term 2
- We include Paralympics sports within our PE lessons and these are an important part of our Healthy Schools Day
- Transport provided to attend competitions.

Impact

The grant has enhanced the experience of all children and staff at Ballifield Primary School. Staff are more confident and skilled in teaching specific PE lessons due to the training they have received. Extra after school clubs have increased interest and participation of all children and children are gaining wider experiences. We look forward to further opportunities to develop our PE curriculum.

Future Plans

- Continue to provide after school clubs run by specialist sports coaches, including Dance, Cheerleading, Basketball, Football and Athletics
- CPD allocation for staff
- Equipment allocation
- Enter further competitions
- Specific training for competitions (Gymnastics)
